Council has finalized the 2014 budget for the town. These are the major items in the budget: Dust control \$30,000; Arena upgrading \$21,000; finalize purchase lagoon land \$170,000; convert generator at water plant to automatic start \$19,000; drainage project east of Block 38, \$40,000; convert town's waste disposal site to WWYRA transfer site (tentative date for transfer October) \$70,000; repair lines within water plant \$15,000; bobcat \$30,000.

Regular yearly items: RCMP contract \$47,310; North Saskatchewan River Municipal Health Holdings (physicians) \$14,320; WWYRA for recycling \$12,780; staffing \$225,730; District Fire Department \$15,000; Library requisition \$10,600; SAMA (assessment agency) \$7,200; gravel & sand \$15,000; debt repayment \$97,165.

The commercial mill rate factor was increased by .1 to 1.6; mill rate remains the same at 6.75; with \$25.00 added to land base tax. Everyone one will see the \$25 extra on their tax notice this year. Tax notices should be in the mail, week of July 25.
